Sadly, Tolly also passed away, but left an incredible testimony of a mother's love for everyone to see, especially her husband and daughters. We assisted Ron Eddins of Monroeville after his wife and triplets were in a fatal car accident. Two of the little ones survived, and I am sure they are all in need of your prayers.
